- ❑ You pay for what you get
- ❑ practice

Camo



- ▣ Camo suit
- ▣ Face & Head cover
- ▣ Warm boots & gloves
- ▣ Always think Safety
- ▣ Should at least wear a hunter orange toque until set-up.
- ▣ Check rules on Hunter Orange.

Guns

- ▣ If you can, working in pairs is better
- ▣ Shotgun and rifle
- ▣ Rifle semi 243 caliber
80 grain bullet
- ▣ Shotgun semi 12
gauge
- ▣ Use Dead Coyote shot
10 per box Cabela's



Shotgun



- ▣ Up close and personal
- ▣ Good for thick bush
- ▣ Use the right size shot for less pelt damage
- ▣ ALWAYS THINK SAFETY
- ▣ Where is your partner
- ▣ Things can happen fast
- ▣ Practice

Rifle

- ▣ Recommend 243 semi auto
- ▣ 80 grain bullet
- ▣ For longer shots in open country
- ▣ Always think Safety
- ▣ Practice



Set up

- ▣ Always think about wind direction
- ▣ Electronic caller remote allows you set the caller in open
- ▣ Think ambush
- ▣ Use a decoy
- ▣ Always think about bullet direction
- ▣ Think Safety



Wolf and Coyote hunting regulation.

- ▣ Valid small game licence.
- ▣ Check your unit - you may need a valid tag
- ▣ Limit of 2 tags
- ▣ Can only party hunt if you have a valid tag.
- ▣ Mandatory reporting whether you hunt or not if you buy a tag.
- ▣ Seasons and no hunting areas.
- ▣ Must wear hunter orange if big game season open.
- ▣ Seal must be attached before moving from kill site.
- ▣ Some units no limits no tags, party hunting allowed.
- ▣ Require a licence to possess during closed season.

Trapping Regulations

- ▣ Some units have a season Sept. 15th to March 31st.
- ▣ Some areas completely closed
- ▣ Some units open all year round.
- ▣ No limits for trappers.
- ▣ Must report on year end harvest.
- ▣ Does not need a licence to possess if reported on year-end harvest report.
